



## 2019-20 access and participation plan monitoring

### Provider impact report

This impact report summarises the progress made by Leeds City College against targets, objectives and written commitments set out in its 2019-20 access and participation plan. This document is a summary of information submitted by the provider to the OfS. This document is a self-report by the provider only and does not indicate any OfS assessment of compliance.

#### 1. Ambition and strategy

Leeds City College's ambition and strategy as detailed in the 2019-20 access and participation plan:

The College will continue to promote social mobility through improving access and outcomes for all students. Priorities include improving access and outcomes for BAME, disabled students and students from low participation areas. Measures will be put in place throughout the whole student lifecycle. The College is working with Go Higher West Yorkshire (GHWY) through the NCOP funding to raise aspirations in low participation areas. This involves working with school children and so the full impact of this will take a number of years to work through to HE.
